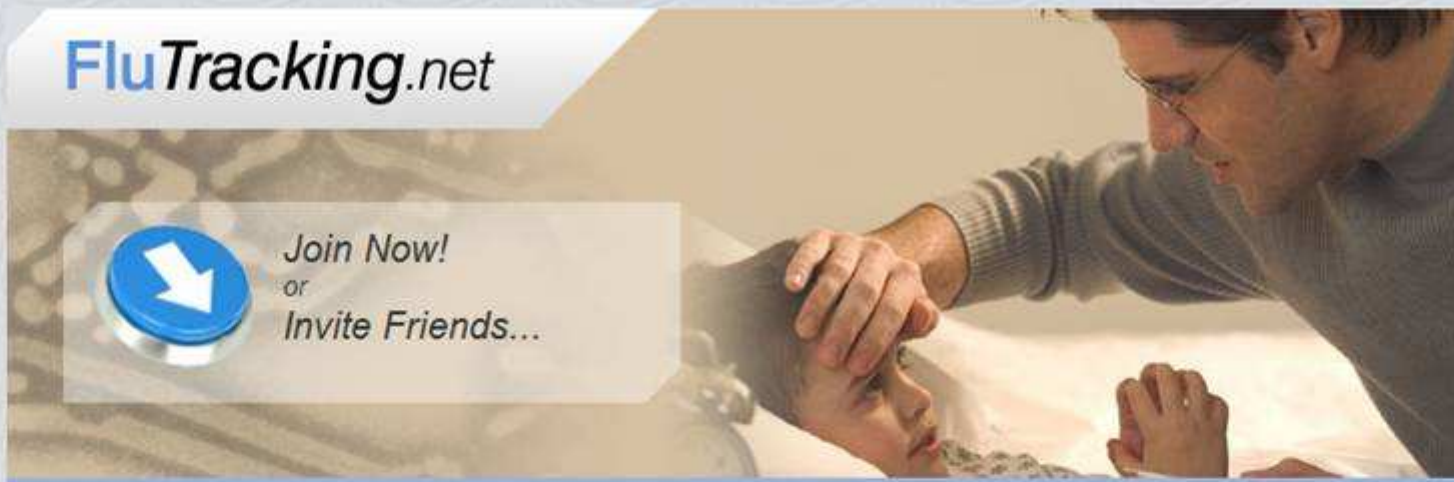

The FluTracking Program

FluTracking was launched in the Australian winter of 2006 with 400 "Flutracker" completing a 10 - 15 second online survey about flu-like symptoms each week.

In the winter of 2007 this increased to approximately 800 participants, and then over 1600 people in the winter of 2008.

By comparing the rate of symptoms between vaccinated and unvaccinated participants we were able to detect when influenza struck because the unvaccinated people had much higher rates of illness than the vaccinated people.
